Upon a motion by Commissioner Lee and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to approve the Regular Expense Claims Report for End of Year 2022.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Lee and second by Commissioner Effinger it was unanimously agreed to approve the Regular Expense Claims Report with Payroll Ledger Report of January 30, 2023.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Lee and second by Commissioner Beach/Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to approve the **Airport Expense Claims Report** of January 30, 2023.

Commissioner Lee reviewed the **Monthly Budget Analysis Report for January 2023** and stated the 2023 Budget is in line with the projected percentage of 8.3 % expenditures.

Commissioner Lee reviewed the **Trial Balance Report for December 2022** and it can be available when requested in the Public Building Commission Office.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Bouse, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the emergency repair with C & K Heating & Cooling in the amount of \$45,540.00.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Bouse, it was agreed to unanimously Approve the utility easement between MidAmerica St. Louis Airport and Century Link with execution to occur contingent upon legal counsel review, with the exception of Commissioner Beach who chose to abstain.

#### **Boeing Lease Agreements**





### 1. Boeing / Cargo Apron / TFT / Amendment #2


The lease agreement was negotiated and developed, which supports the continued growth at the MidAmerica St Louis Airport (BLV). Project improvements were captured as part of the lease rent and now will extend through February 29, 2024. The purpose of this amendment includes the lease premises being reduced by +/-1,300 SF of airside land and associated telemetry trailer and antennas, with all landside portions and associated office trailers no longer to be included.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The Revenue from the lease amendment #2 will be used for the operations and maintenance of the airport.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute the lease agreement Amendment #2 with Boeing."



### Utility Easement – CenturyLink





### 2. Utility Easement – CenturyLink

The MetroLink Extension project requires extensions and relocations of existing utilities. To allow these extensions and relocations to occur, easements must be granted. MidAmerica St. Louis Airport and Gonzalez Companies (on behalf of St. Clair County Transit District) have been coordinating with CenturyLink Communications, LLC on an easement to allow relocation of their underground communications infrastructure.

Financial Impact: There is no fiscal impact to MidAmerica St. Louis Airport.

Motion: "Move to approve the utility easement between the MidAmerica St. Louis Airport and Ameren with execution to occur contingent upon legal counsel review."



### 3. Professional Services / ORAT / CMT

ORAT service is a tried and tested methodology that de-risks the activation of new services and facilities, including airport terminal projects. It's a proven set of tools and methodologies that helps plan and prepare thoroughly – building confidence for a trouble-free day-one and beyond. Such complex programs also tend to involve a wide variety of groups with diverse interests and priorities, who must work together to deliver many tasks at critical stages.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The professional agreement for ORAT services Amendment #1 was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute Amendment #1 with CMT for a cost Not-to-Exceed \$186,315."



# 4. Consulting Services / Terminal Expansion / Amendment #8 / CMT

The Airport Challenges associated with the COVID pandemic have resulted in material shortages, subcontractor delays, and overall delays to the completion of this project. These delays have resulted in increased Construction Phase Services fees. Total costs associated with these delays are accounted for in Amendment #8 at a cost not to exceed \$430,820.


<u>Financial Impact</u>: The consulting services / Amendment #8 was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute Amendment #8 with CMT for a cost Not-to-Exceed \$430,820."



### Non-AIP / Terminal Modifications / Amendment #5







### 5. Non-AIP / Terminal Modifications / Amendment #5

Amendment #5 of non-AIP eligible construction is for renovations to the existing terminal building footprint. This work includes flooring replacement, restroom renovations, airline offices, car rental offices, etc. The PBC approved the work associated with the flooring replacement in December 2022. The remaining portion of the Interior Renovations work includes renovations to the restrooms on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floors.

Financial Impact: Change order #5 was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute Change Order #5 with Holland Construction for a cost Not-to-Exceed \$1,500,000.



### 6. AIP / Terminal Modifications / Pre-Construction Services

The Airport has been coordinating with Customs and Border Protection (CBP) regarding improvements to the existing CBP General Aviation Facility (GAF) and a new Federal Inspection Station (FIS) to be incorporated into Phase 4 of the terminal construction. This effort is the subject of a recent FAA Airport Terminal Program (ATP) grant application.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The Terminal Modifications Phase-4 was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute the Pre-Construction Services agreement with Holland Construction for a cost Not-to-Exceed \$100,000."







