Public Building Commission Meeting Minutes

August 17, 2023

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Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Dinges, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Regular Monthly Meeting Minutes of July 20, 2023.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Dinges and second by Commissioner Lee it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Regular Expense Claims Report with Payroll Ledger Report of August 30, 2023.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Dinges and second by Commissioner Lee, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Airport Expense Claims Report of August 30, 2023.

Commissioner Dinges reviewed the **Monthly Budget Analysis Report for August 2023** and stated the 2023 Budget is in line with the projected percentage of 66.7.% expenditures with the exception of Economic Development due to Major Capital Improvements.

Commissioner Dinges reviewed the **Trial Balance Report for July 2023** and it can be available when requested in the Public Building Commission Office.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Terry Beach and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the appointment of Darren James as Interim Director of St. Louis MidAmerica Airport with the same salary that Bryan Johnson was earning.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Beach and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Bid Award for the Public Service Facility at 313 West Washington, for Election Equipment with Millennium Construction for an amount of \$2,044,887.00 in addition to adding \$5,300.00 for painting exterior stone.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Beach and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Lease between Public Building Commission and OSPS (Office of Statewide Pretrial Services) for a 5 year Lease.

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Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Brown, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Professional Services Agreement with the Hauser Group for a 5-year Agreement with a \$50,000.00 Cap.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Bouse, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Amendment #10 Phase 4 FIS to the Engineering Agreement with CMT for a cost not-to-exceed \$250,625.00.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Bouse and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Change Order #28, Terminal Modifications, Curbside Improvements Holland Construction for a cost not-to-exceed \$1,822,364.00.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Brown, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Change Order #17 to Contract 2021-15, Non- CMAR with Holland Construction, Inc. at a cost not-to-exceed \$613,825.00.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Bouse and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Change Order #18 to Contract 2021-15, Non-AIP CMAR-Miscellaneous Terminal with Holland Construction, Inc. at a cost not-to-exceed \$780,209.00.

1. Professional Services Agreement / The Hauser Group

The Hauser Group is a St. Louis-based public relations firm focused on raising awareness, generating results for a host of noteworthy clients. 2. Professional Services Agreement / FIS Phase 4 / Amendment #10 / CMT

BLV & CBP additional design services include an early document package to facilitate the early procurement of certain long-lead items and to accelerate the beginning of construction and phased construction documents articulated to facilitate the construction of the building shell and the GAF ahead and independent of the construction of the FIS.


<u>Financial Impact</u>: Amendment #10 (design services) was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chair to execute Amendment #10 Phase 4 FIS to the engineering agreement with CMT at a cost Not to Exceed \$250,625."






CURBSIDE



- Maintain existing heated curbs only revise current curb cut areas
- Increase curb depth continuous for entire length
- Remove 2 crosswalks yields 245' & 206" between crosswalks
- · Orient north crosswalk perpendicular to curbside
- Plan drive lanes to be 12' wide
- Place Bollards 5'-7' from curb for car doors & movement

3. Terminal Expansion / Curbside Improvements – CO#28 / AIP

Bulletin 41 issued drawings which defined improvements to the terminal curb front. The improvements include widening of the sidewalk, eliminating the 6" curb thereby creating a curb front which is entirely accessible, adding bollards along the extent of the curb front to protect the terminal and pedestrians, and resurfacing the drop off / pick up lanes.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: Change Order #28 (curbside improvements) will be funded through an AIP amendment with submission to the FAA.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chair to execute Change Order #28, Terminal Modifications, curbside improvements with Holland Construction, Inc. at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$1,822,364."





4. Terminal Expansion / IT Improvements — CO#17 / Non-AIP

Per BLV direction, CMT / Faith Group completed this analysis and generated bulletins 2 and 3 to the project. These bulletins include upgraded communications cabling, additional fiber optic backbone cabling, Wi-Fi in the terminal, labelling and identification of existing communications infrastructure, and associated work.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: Change Order #17 for Non-AIP eligible work was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chair to execute Change Order #17 to Contract 2021-15, Non-AIP CMAR with Holland Construction, Inc. at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$613,825."





5. Terminal Expansion / IT Room Improvements — CO#18 / Non-AIP

The main components of this work include replacement of this room's Air Conditioning and UPS (uninterruptible power supply). These items were originally planned for replacement in coordination with the subject project. However, the priority and scope of this replacement have evolved as this room now houses other, critical SCC IT infrastructure. CMT (with Faith Group and HOK as subconsultants) included the HVAC and UPS replacements as bulletin 4 to the project.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: Change Order #18 for Non-AIP eligible work was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chair to execute Change Order #18 to Contract 2021-15, Non-AIP CMAR — Miscellaneous Terminal, with Holland Construction, Inc. at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$780,209."



6. Demolition of Old Scott School

When the schools were relocated, the old schools remained on the property and were not initially demolished. The PBC authorized a project to demolish the schools at the February 2023 meeting. The proposed project includes environmental remediation and demolition of the two former Scott Schools and all associated components. After demolition, the land will be returned to its natural state and incorporated into the adjacent agricultural leases.

<u>Financial Impact:</u> The Old Scott School Demolition will be funded by St. Clair County ARPA funds.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chair to execute the agreement for demolition of Old Scott School with S. Shafer Excavation, Inc. at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$606,000."



7. Terminal Lease Agreement / Holland Construction

Historically, terminal lease space has been limited due to the lack of availability and subsequently due to lack of activity or interest. Recent improvements and additional office space will allow for new opportunities to support a variety of airline and non-airline activities. The future airline base will likely consume most if not all the terminal lease space. Until then, it is desirable to lease certain office space to Holland Construction, Inc, a non-airline entity. The lease area will encompass approximately 892 square feet (see attachment) for \$38.50 ppsf-annum.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: Revenue from the lease agreement will be used solely for the operations and maintenance of the Airport.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chair to execute the terminal lease agreement between MidAmerica St. Louis Airport and Holland Construction, Inc."
